Riders without a valid USAC license must purchase a One-Day License (\$10) sold at registration and are eligible to compete in Category 4 events only.

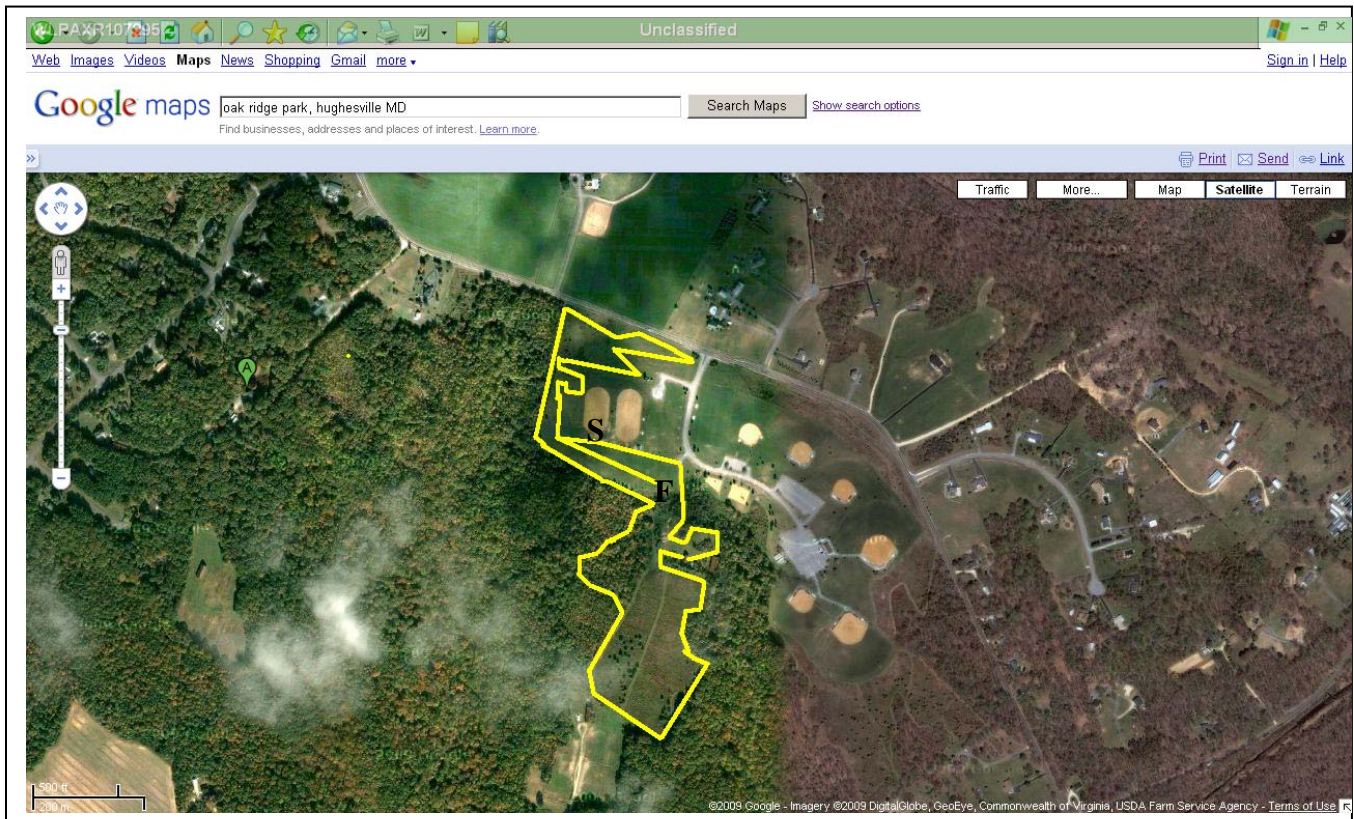

COURSE:

The All Hallows Eve Cross course is located on the grounds of Oak Ridge Park at 13675 Oaks Rd. Hughesville, MD 20637. It is approximately 2.5km in length and consists of a grass start and finish, grass and hard pack terrain, a trail descent and climb and some off camber turns. The course will have three man-made obstacles. Above map is a representation only, race day course may be different.

From Beltway Exit 7-A, take Branch Ave/MD-5 S toward Waldorf. After 13 miles, turn left on Mattawoman Beantown Rd to stay on MD 5. After 3 miles, turn left at Leonardtown Rd/MD-5 S. After 4.9 miles, turn right onto Oliver's Shop Rd. After 2.6 miles, turn left onto Oaks Rd and go 1.3 miles to Oak Ridge Park on the right

RAIL TRAIL

The Indian Head Rail Trail is Charles County's exciting new recreational trail. A generous gift through the Department of Interior's Federal Lands to Parks Program, Charles County is currently converting this abandoned railroad corridor into a 13 mile-bike trail. Eventually connecting the Town of Indian Head to Route 301 in White Plains, the IHRT traverses approximately halfway across our County.

Without doubt, the IHRT is a unique opportunity to enjoy some of Southern Maryland's most undeveloped natural areas. Originally built in 1918 as a supply route for the Navy's Indian Head Powder Factory, this elevated rail bed passes through the Mattawoman Creek stream valley. Cyclists, hikers and nature enthusiasts will experience the surroundings of mature forests, natural wetlands and occasional farmland. Wildlife abounds! Visiting the IHRT is almost like stepping back in time.
